June 30, 5:30 pm at the Hyatt Regency Dallas Hotel. A Change-making Conversation on Race and Gender with Anthea Butler and Beth Allison Barr, two of the most prominent voices speaking to the American church on these topics.

Anthea Butler serves as the Geraldine R. Segal Professor in American Social Thought and as chair of the department of religious studies at the University of Pennsylvania. Her most recent book is *White Evangelical Racism: The Politics of Morality in America*. And her next book, currently in process, is *Reading Race: How Publishing Created a Lifeline for Black Baptists in Post Reconstruction America*.

Beth Allison Barr serves as the James Vardaman Professor of History at Baylor University in Waco, Texas. She is the author of the bestselling book *The Making of Biblical Womanhood*.
