



- Our Justice Team is working with Faith in Texas on the Just Housing Campaign. Just housing envisions a Dallas that provides diverse, fair and safe housing for all people, regardless of income source, gender identity and sexuality, citizenship status, and criminal history.
- Our faith says that every person has dignity, and therefore should have a dignified place to live. We want to end the housing crisis, but to do that, we have to understand the problem. Filling out this survey helps us find solutions that actually meet the need.
- We believe in listening to the people who are closest to the pain, and who are left on the
 margins of our society. If you have experienced discrimination, we want to hear about it
 so we can help stop it from happening.
- Even if you haven't experienced discrimination, fill out the survey we need an idea of how often discrimination is occurring, which means we need to hear from everyone!
- If you want to help fight for just housing in Dallas, be sure to say so on the survey, so members of our Justice Team can help you get involved!

¹⁰Now he was teaching in one of the synagogues on the sabbath. 11And just then there appeared a woman with a spirit that had crippled her for eighteen years. She was bent over and was quite unable to stand up straight. 12When Jesus saw her, he called her over and said, "Woman, you are set free from your ailment." 13When he laid his hands on immediately she stood up straight and began praising God. ¹⁴But the leader of the synagogue, indignant because Jesus had cured on the sabbath, kept saying to the crowd, "There are six days on which work ought to be done; come on those days and be cured, and not on the sabbath day." 15But the Lord answered him and said, "You hypocrites! Does not each of you on the sabbath until his ox or his donkey from the manger, and lead it away to give it water? ¹⁶And ought not this woman, a daughter of Abraham whom Satan bound for eighteen long years, be set free from this bondage on the sabbath day?" 17When he said this, all his opponents were put to shame; and the entire crowd was rejoicing at all the wonderful things that he was doing.
