# What Am I Murmuring?

News of the week disheartens me. Currents of injustice, inequality, accusations. Defensiveness and hate. It seems all too pervasive to change, to have a goal and go after it, determined to create something new. Then again, maybe it is all in the approach - or so I learned from watching starlings. I invite you to take 2 minutes (literally) of silence to watch this wonder-full dance <a href="https://vimeo.com/58291553">https://vimeo.com/58291553</a>

Defined, synchronized patterns. Swooping and swirling in beautiful unison. And there is no single leader directing what seems to be an orchestrated dance. I learned that each single starling is in energetic connection with 7 of its neighbors, and each of those 7 with 7 more. Each one sharing its energy with those around it, 7+7+7...until an entire flock (a phenomenon called 'murmuration') is unified in motion. The movement is not created by a choreographed goal. The shape emerges organically as each bird murmurs in connection with those around it. Each one IS the goal that spreads throughout the flock as it moves dynamically with the currents.

Be the change you wish to see in the world, Gandhi murmured. Gandhi lived nonviolence. People followed and a movement grew in the current of the day. Follow me, Jesus murmured. Jesus lived the fullness of Love and walked the way of peace and there were many who followed him. (I need a sidebar here, a "reminder to self". Jesus never said, "worship me." That's too easy. Worship a leader and then go do as I please? But follow me, that's a whole different story!) Jesus' way became a movement, through practicing what he preached and building relationships, and bringing healing. Jesus was the change he wished to create in the world. Love and Life. Rather than go after a goal or worship one, he lived the goal.

As news disheartens me (with its deepening divides), am I going to worship the goal of a choreographed dance of justice, equality, hope and love? Or am I willing to look within myself and live what I wish to see amid the current of the day?

I better think about what my murmuring sounds like! I think I'll watch the starlings again.

# Social Justice Team Candlelight Prayer Walk Friday, September 18 – 8:30 pm

You are invited to participate in the **Social Justice Team Candlelight Prayer Walk**, Friday, September 18, 8:30 pm. See guide on the next page for parking and gathering group information and more. Please read the participant guide prior to your arrival on September 18.

## **Participant Guide**

Royal Lane Baptist Church - Social Justice Team

### Candlelight Prayer Walk

### Arriving at church:

- · Park anywhere other than the big, corner parking lot.
- · Wear masks, have personal hand sanitizer, and maintain social distancing.
- · No entrance to buildings Worship Sites and Walking Paths are outside.

### Choose your Gathering Site:

Site A: east of Vickrey Hall - (stairs included when walking) (max 12 participants)

Site B: corner parking lot - (flat, level walking)
(max 24 participants)

Site C: front steps of Sanctuary - sit on the steps or stand nearby, at least six feet apart - no candles - no walking (max - till area is full)

### Arrive at your Gathering Site:

- Silence cell phones
- Pick up a single, sanitized candle, only touching that one (Sites A & B only)
- Maintain a sense of solemn yet fervent expectation as all gather at your Site
- Keep your mask on
- Maintain social distancing

### At your Gathering Site - Directions from your Site Leader:

- Preview instructions for Walking Path (Sites A & B only)
  - o describe path for walking in a one-way circuit
  - o walk individually at least 6 feet behind the person in front of you
  - o move intentionally and with careful steps
  - o remain in single file as you walk together
  - o hold your candle in front of you, as a witness to those driving by
  - o walk the circuit path until you are done meditating
- Keep your mask on and maintain social distancing
- Rehearse Responsive phrase
- Listen for a single phrase to focus your meditation
- Plan for the reverent ending (see below)
- Practice Responsive phrase one more time

### Responsive Reading and Candlelight Prayer Walk - (keep your mask on)

#### LIPS

Participate in the Responsive Reading - listen for your phrase

#### HEART

Meditate on your phrase - reflect within your heart

### FEET (Sites A & B only)

Walk the circuit together - pray in the glow of your candle. (repeat the circuit until you're done praying)

### Reverent Ending:

- Return your candle to your Gathering Site when you're done walking
- Move quietly back to your car, maintaining a sense of meditation
- If desired, have conversations near your car, maintaining social distancing and wearing your mask.




